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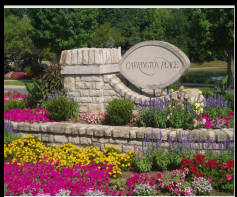

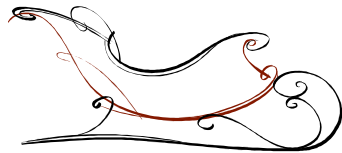

## Cranberry Bread Recipe

### Ingredients:

3 eggs  
2 cups sugar  
¾ cup butter, softened  
1 tsp. Almond extract  
2 cups flour  
2-1/2 cups fresh or frozen cranberries, washed & drained  
2/3 cup pecans, chopped

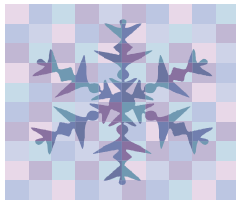
### Directions:

Beat eggs and sugar until slightly thickened and light in color. (about 5 minutes)  
Add butter and almond extract. Beat 2 minutes. Stir in flour just until combined. Fold in cranberries and pecans. Mixture will be thick. Press into 9 x 13 greased pan. Bake at 350 for 45 to 60 minutes, or until golden brown.  
This old-fashioned bread is wonderful as is! It can also be served with whipped cream, cool whip or glazed.

## Street Parking Matter

The Trustees have been receiving numerous complaints concerning the number of trucks and cars parked on the streets. This is becoming a major safety issue. The heights of some trucks clearly block street signage (i.e. stop signs), as well as large parts of other driver's field of vision. We all live in a neighborhood filled with children. We are urging the residents to please park in your garage/driveway first, use the street curb bordering your property second and neighbors street curbs as the last resort. We appreciate everyone's attention to the issue and please remember, that the following are in violation of our deed restrictions:

- No truck, camper, commercial vehicle, etc. shall be parked or stored on any lot unless it is in a garage;
